How to reach the Florence historic centre 13

In this Walking tour the entrance to the museums, as well as to the inside of the Florence Cathedral, is not foreseen. However, this tour can be combined with other tours and hiking routes in <u>Florence</u> and <u>Siena</u>, which can be found on the **Menu**.

The proposed activity **is not a joinable tour**, but a private tour that can be arranged upon request for individuals or groups through a tourist agency. The tour can be customised based on the customer's preferences, including the start time, meeting place, and duration.

Duration of Florence private guided

tour

The museum tour lasts up to 3 hours and covers the interior of the Cathedral (with priority access with the ticket), to the remainders of early medieval Santa Reparata church, to the Baptistery up to the Museo dell'Opera del Duomo. The <u>visit</u> <u>to the bell tower and the dome is excluded from</u> <u>the tour</u>; it can be done independently with the entrance ticket.

The 3-hour tour can be customised according to the customer's preferences and needs.

Cost of Florence Cathedral private guided tour

The price for up to a 3-hour tour is **180.00** € (total price, not per person).

Radio rental compulsory from 4 people onwards

For groups of 5 or more people, it is highly recommended to rent radio devices to facilitate listening to the guide's explanations and ensure social distancing both outdoors and indoors. For visits inside the museums, as well as inside the cathedral, radios are mandatory for groups of 4 or more people. The guide will arrange the rental service, but the cost of €1.50 per person for up to 3 hours will be charged to the customer. The payment can be made directly to the guide, who will handle the payment to the supplier. Carers or teachers of school groups are exempt from paying for radio rentals.

Opening times Florence Cathedral

Since the opening hours of the Duomo may vary due to religious functions, is strictly recommend checking the opening hours directly on the official website. To do so, click <u>here</u> and then click on the clock icon at the bottom left. Set the date for when you plan to visit the Duomo. Please keep in mind that the interior of the Cathedral is closed to visitors on Sundays. However, other sites of the Cathedral such as Santa Reparata, Baptistery, Museo dell'Opera, dome, and Giotto's bell tower may be partially or fully open on Sundays.

Tickets can be purchased on the complex's **official website**.

Since the guide has his museum pass for entry, the customer **doesn't need to buy** the museum ticket for him. However, if the customer wants to be guided on the dome, then it is necessary to buy a ticket for the guide as well (Brunelleschi Pass).

Limited number of people per group

As per regulations, groups visiting the Cathedral sites must not exceed **20 individuals**, excluding the guide

Important information about the access to the Dome and Bell tower

It is no possible for tourist guides to access the dome to accompany visitors, unless the customer pays the entrance ticket for the guide, which costs € 30.00 (Brunelleschi Pass). If the customer enters the dome without a guide, he will still be given all the information necessary in advance to enjoy the visit independently. For the remaining sites, customers <u>don't need to purchase the ticket of the</u> <u>Cathedral complex to the tour guide</u>. **TAKE NOTICE**: please, note that to access the dome lantern you have to **climb 463 steps** and there are **no elevators**, as well as for the **bell tower** whose steps are **414**. The ascent to the dome is **not recommended** for the people suffering from **heart disease** and **vertigo**.

Due to the large turnout in high season, it is highly recommended to purchase the access ticket to the dome (**Brunelleschi Pass**) by the purchasing of the ticket on the <u>official store</u> and to do so **well in advance**. The Brunelleschi Pass also includes access to Giotto's bell tower.

Forbidden to access the complex with backpacks/bags/luggages

To access each of the sites of the Florence Cathedral complex, it is **mandatory to leave any backpacks, bags or luggage outside**; Luggage storage (large cloakroom) is available free of charge in <u>Piazza Duomo 38R</u>, near the entrance to the Museo dell'Opera del Duomo. Backpacks, bags or luggage can be taken back at the end of the visit. Click <u>here</u> to read the complete rules.

The guide **does not provide private transport service**, which entails the client needs to reach the meeting point established in the route on his own.

How to book the tour?

The tour can be booked by writing an <u>email</u>, calling +393332591526 or texting the guide (also via <u>Whatsapp</u> or <u>Telegram</u>) to check availability for the requested day. The payment for the tour can be made after the service, by credit card or cash.

Cancellation Policy

It is the responsibility of the guide **to guarantee the guide service in any case**. If, even for personal reasons, the guide is unable to perform the service on the date set with the client, it will be his concern to contact a reliable colleague who can replace him and therefore guarantee customer service.

The cancellation of the tour from the client can be done free of charge by giving timely notice to the guide 48 hours before the date and time agreed for the service. In this case, the customer **doesn't have** **to pay anything**. If instead cancellation is made by the customer when there are less than 48 hours before the date agreed for the service,

the customer must pay an amount corresponding to 50% of the total rate.

The eventual tickets bought by the guide for the museums, whose money was advanced by the customer, are not refundable.

How to reach the Florence historic centre

By car

Reachable via the A1 motorway (<u>Firenze Scandicci</u> exit and from there continue towards the center, reaching the area of the Santa Maria Novella station, where there is a multi-storey underground car park (reachable only for vehicles with engines from EURO 6 onwards). From the station underpass, <u>Piazza di Santa Maria Novella</u> can be reached in a few minutes.

As a **cheaper alternative** to the underground car park, there is the <u>Piazzale Montelungo</u> car park (always subject to charges). An excellent alternative to car parking near the historic centre is to leave the vehicle at the <u>Villa Costanza</u> car park and from there take the **T1 tram line** which takes about 22 minutes to reach the Santa Maria Novella station. The T1 line has stops both before and after the Santa Maria station Novella that can be convenient to reach any accommodation For more information on the Tramvia timetables and stops <u>click here</u>.

By private bus lines

There are connections of private lines to reach Florence, such as <u>Italbus</u> and <u>Flixbus</u> which reach the <u>Villa Costanza</u> tramway station; from the latter the tram line takes about 22 minutes to reach Santa Maria Novella station. By plane

Florence can be reached by plane via the <u>Amerigo</u> <u>Vespucci Airport</u>. From here the historic centre is connected: **By tram** The **T2 line** of the Tramway connects Florence Airport with the centre and arrives at <u>Piazza</u> <u>dell'Unità italiana</u>. By Train

Florence can be reached by train with the <u>Trenitalia</u> service. Depending on your accommodation needs, you can arrive in <u>Firenze</u> <u>Santa Maria Novella</u>, <u>Firenze Rifredi</u> or <u>Firenze</u> <u>Campo di Marte</u>. With the regional lines then Florence can also be reached from other cities of Tuscany.

Organised groups with a tourist coach

For **organised groups by touristic bus**, there are drop-off/drop-on points for passengers in the urban centre of Florence (click here to view the points).

Tourist coaches are subject to the payment of a **checkpoint** (more information <u>here</u>).

By Camper

Camper owners find car parks for campers (only some of these are equipped) in <u>Via delle Porte</u> <u>Sante</u>, in <u>Piazza Vittorio Veneto</u>, in <u>Viale Abramo</u> <u>Lincoln</u>, in <u>Via Luigi Castaldi</u>, in <u>Largo Alcide De</u> <u>Gasperi</u>, at the <u>Florence Scandicci Park</u> (the latter connected to the centre with the <u>Nelli-Torregalli</u> tram stop).
